Words	Actions (storyteller's perspective)
This is a Christian story about Lent. Lent is the time when we prepare for Easter.	Make rectangle house with doorway and path
Once, there was a person who lived in a place. Some bits looked lovely, other parts were kinda messy,	Add person in house. Add neat row of pretty things and an untidy pile of random things
and there was a big stain on the carpet	Fold grey blob in half and place in one corner
One day, a message arrived. "It would be lovely to see you sometime. Is tomorrow OK? Love God."	Place figure and two small blue circles at end of path
"Oh No! Everything is such a mess!" said the person and they started cleaning the house. They swept and brushed. They tidied and polished.	Move person around between objects, moving things from one place to another. End with objects a little tidier, but still messy
They scrubbed and scrubbed and scrubbed at the stain, but it would not budge.	Dab person at stain, then return to middle
They worked so hard that they didn't notice it was the next day. There was a knock at the door.	Knock on table
"It's me," said God, "I've brought cake."	Move figure and circles to outside door
"You can't come in!" said the person. "I haven't finished tidying." "I came to see you," said God, "not your house. I can cope with the mess."	Person runs around frantically
But the person still did not open the door. "Are you worried about the stain?" said God. "I can take that away if you let me in."	Add disc in house
So the person opened the door and they had cake together. And after a while, the stain disappeared.	God and person together in the house, one blue circle each Remove grey blob
